Missouri Locals Continue Legislation Education

In Missouri, Locals 655, 88, and 2 have more than 15 people working across five Senate districts to raise awareness around Right to Work and paycheck deception legislation, and will soon be expanding their work to another five districts. During the current legislative break, the locals are also working with Jobs with Justice to set up in-district meetings with legislators to discuss these important legislative issues and their impact on working families. **OP**

Recall Efforts Move Forward in Wisconsin

Recall efforts continue in Wisconsin, where on Friday a Dane County Circuit Court Judge issued a temporary restraining order against Governor Walker's anti-collective bargaining law. The emergency order, blocking publication of the bill, was granted after a lawsuit was filed alleging that a joint legislative committee violated Wisconsin's open meetings law when it hastily scheduled a hearing on Walker's bill. The bill cannot take effect until it is published, and it cannot be published until the lawsuit is adjudicated.

Nearly half the signatures needed to force Republican legislative targets into a recall have been collected, with

Ohio Workers to Lobby Against SB5

UFCW members in Ohio will be taking their message to their elected officials during a lobby day on Wednesday,

March 23. Members are speaking out against SB5, Governor Kasich's anti-worker bill, which is currently being considered by the House, as well as Kasich's "no new jobs" budget. **OP**

School in Haiti Nears Completion

At the end of March, James Stine College in Haiti will begin registration for 7th-10th grade students. After the



devastating earthquake in Haiti, UFCW activists in Canada and the United States mobilized to raise nearly \$500,000 for the Haiti relief effort. Through the Mortel Family Charitable Foundation, UFCW funds were dedicated to building a computer lab and library for James Stine College, a high school in St. Marc, Haiti, where thousands of Haitians have relocated since the earthquake.

The school will provide quality secondary education to poor Haitian children who have completed

elementary education in the city and neighboring towns and parishes. When students complete the curriculum after 7 years, they will be ready to enter medical school, law school, and other graduate programs and technical schools.

The religious congregation in charge of the school will move in by June, and furnishings will be added to the classrooms in July when youth from mission trips arrive in Haiti. The volunteers will help put on the finishing touches in preparation for when the students arrive in September.

Dr. Rodrigue Mortel, founder of The Mortel Family Charitable Foundation, had a message for all those who helped aid the project: "You have helped make these students' dream of a brighter future a reality because of the completion of James Stine College. Thank you!" **OP**
